With whom and what am I connected?	5 Jewish t(w)eens learn about and positively experience Jewish holidays and Shabbat.

	7 Jewish t(w)eens develop strong and healthy relationships with their families.
	8 Jewish t(w)eens develop significant relationships with mentors, role models, and educators.
To whom and for what am I responsible in this world?	9 Jewish t(w)eens are able to express their values and ethics in relation to Jewish principles and wisdom.
	10 Jewish t(w)eens develop the capacity (skills and language) that allows them to grapple with and express their spiritual journeys.
	11 Jewish t(w)eens feel connected to their various communities.
	12 Jewish t(w)eens develop the desire and commitment to be part of the Jewish people now and in the future.
How can I bring about change in this world?	13 Jewish t(w)eens develop a positive relationship to the land, people, and State of Israel.
	14 Jewish t(w)eens are inspired and empowered to make a positive difference in various communities and world in which they live.
