
Parking Located on 71st Ave. and Kissena Blvd (behind National Wholesale Liquidators)


Note: This location is approximately a quarter of a mile from the school. We will be providing a shuttle service in the morning and afternoon for anyone who prefers to use it.

COVID19 Policy

The Jewish Education Project prioritizes the health and safety of our community. We closely monitor CDC and local health authority's COVID-19 guidance, and follow those guidelines. FAQs

1. What accessibility accommodations will you have in place for the conference?

It is of utmost of importance that your needs are met. If you have any mobility issues the following accommodations will be available: Main entrance has a ramp, elevators access to each floor, accessible bathrooms, reserved spaces in the parking lot near the school <u>(please reach out in advance if you require a space to park in our small lot)</u>, shuttle bus available from large parking lot to school.

2. Is there a dedicated space for nursing mothers?
