What happened in October-November 2022?


October-November 2022 'shined a light' on antisemitism in the U.S. This presentation is a conversation about what transpired with Kanye "Ye" West (musical artist), Kryie Irving (basketball player), and David Chappelle (comedian).



On October 8, 2022, musician Kanye "Ye" West authored the below antisemitic post on Twitter.



Ye West



- What do you think "death con 3" meant?
- What does Ye mean that he "can't be Anti Semitic"?
- Ye referred to the Jewish people as "You guys." What was he explicitly blaming on the Jewish people?
- What is the potential impact of this tweet getting over 4,300 Retweets?

The Holocaust Museum of Los Angeles reached out to Ye to invite him to visit and learn about the power of words to "incite" or "inspire." Ye did not accept the invitation.

Questions for Discussion:

- What was the Holocaust Museum LA attempting to do in this outreach to Ye?
- · Why did the museum include a statement about the Armenian people?
- Think about the sentence, "Your words reach millions and you can choose to incite or you can choose to inspire." What are your thoughts about that?

A STATEMENT FROM HOLOCAUST MUSEUM LA

Words matter and words have consequences Ye. We urge you to come visit us at Holocaust Museum LA to understand just how words can incite horrific violence and genocides. The Holocaust started with only words that sadly begat stereotypes, racial and religious tropes and blaming others and led to the murder of six million Jews. At Holocaust Museum LA it is our mission to commemorate those who were murdered, educate on the Holocaust and all genocides including the genocide perpetrated against the Armenian People (of which your children would be included), and inspire a more dignified and humane world.

Your words reach millions and you can choose to incite or you can choose to inspire. We are located at 100 The Grove Drive, Los Angeles, CA 90036 and welcome you any time.

There was significant backlash from his tweet, including a lot of public pressure for Adidas to end their \$250+ million dollar contract with Ye.

Ye came out eight days after the tweet, stating that his Adidas deal was solidly in place, and that there is essentially nothing he could do that would jeopardize his Adidas Yeezy partnership.

Question for Discussion:

 Why would Ye believe that his words would have no negative consequences on his professional relationships?

On October 25, 2022, Adidas came out with a formal announcement that they would be cutting all business ties with Ye due expressly to his antisemitic remarks. Ye was also dropped by:

- Radio stations (21.4% less air time)
- Business partners and talent agency
- Balenciaga, Gap, Footlocker brand and/or retail partners
- MRC, filmmakers, and distribution partners preparing to release new Ye documentary
- · ...and many more

The link at the bottom of this slide provides a detailed timeline of the fallout Ye experienced due to his antisemitic remarks.

Questions for Discussion:

- Why would businesses want to disassociate with Ye, costing them millions of dollars in sales?
- Why do you think Adidas nearly three weeks to speak up? (some say too long)
- Do you think the ADL-Anti-defamation League had a part in Adidas' decision? (see ADL statement to the right)

adidas terminates partnership with Ye immediately

adidas does not tolerate antisemitism and any other sort of hate speech. Ye's recent comments and actions have been unacceptable, hateful and dangerous, and they violate the company's values of diversity and inclusion, mutual respect and fairness.

After a thorough review, the company has taken the decision to terminate the partnership with Ye immediately, end production of Yeezy branded products and stop all payments to Ye and his companies. adidas will stop the adidas Yeezy business with immediate effect.

This is expected to have a short-term negative impact of up to €250 million on the company's net income in 2022 given the high seasonality of the fourth quarter.

adidas is the sole owner of all design rights to existing products as well as previous and new colorways under the partnership. More information will be given as part of the company's upcoming Q3 earnings announcement on November 9, 2022.

This is a very positive outcome. It illustrates that antisemitism is unacceptable and creates consequences. Without a doubt, Adidas has done the right thing by cutting ties with Ye after his vicious antisemitic rants. We were proud to see many joined ADL's campaign, #RunawayfromHate, that pressured Adidas toward this decision, including the thousands of people who sent emails, the dozens of celebrities who spoke up, and the prominent brands who cut ties. Taken together, all these elements sent an unambiguous signal that moved the company to take action. In the end, Adidas action sends a powerful message that antisemitism and bigotry have no place in society.

In the days following Ye's comments on Twitter, neo-Nazis in Los Angeles were seen on an overpass brandishing the Nazi salute, with signs supporting the views shared by Ye.

- Why would a group of people, who traditionally express hate for black people, stand up and support Ye right now?
- What is being expressed by the Nazi salute while standing next to the American flag?
- Goyim TV is an antisemitic video-sharing website.
 What do you think is the intention of these demonstrators in sharing this media site?



Following his contract being ended by Adidas and other professional fallout, Ye went on a right-wing conservative media blitz. One stop was the Piers Morgan podcast where he shared that he doesn't hate

Jews, he is jealous of them. (video link provided below)

During the interview, Ye stated:

I'm envious of the Jewish people.

I'm envious of how they don't abort their children.

I'm envious of how they don't shoot each other in the streets and then rap about it.

I'm envious of how their families stay together.

I'm envious of how they turn their phones off on Friday night and their family comes together.

I'm envious of how they do business together.

And I want that for the darker Jews.

I want that for the black people.


I want that. We need that.

- Why does Ye use language of 'envy'?
- Does Ye intend for 'envy' to be a positive?
- What is the underlying message Ye expresses here?

Following Ye West's antisemitic tweet, New York Nets basketball player Kyrie Irving shared a link to the film 'Hebrews to Negroes: Wake Up Black America' on Twitter. This film is widely criticized for being antisemitic and perpetuating a number of anti-Jewish conspiracy theories.

- What was Kyrie's intention behind sharing this film in a tweet?
- Do you think Kyrie shared this believing this was antisemitic?
- If this film is known to be widely criticized and controversial, why is Amazon carrying it on their platform?

In response to Kyrie's tweet, the National Basketball Player's Association (NBPA) spoke out against antisemitism (statement below). Following his tweet, Kyrie was asked by a media outlet about whether he has antisemitic beliefs. He did not say "no" unequivocally (ADL response below). Following that interview, the NBA suspended Kyrie for a minimum of five games. (statement to the right)

NBPA Statement

NEW YORK, NY, November 1, 2022 – The NBPA today issued the following statement:

"Anti-Semitism has no place in our society. The NBPA is focused on creating an environment where everyone is accepted. We are committed to helping players fully understand that certain words can lead to hateful ideologies being spread. We will continue to work on identifying and combating all hate speech wherever it arises."



Over the last several days, we have made repeated attempts to work with Kyrile Ivring to help him understand the harm and danger of his words and actions, whic began with him publicing a film containing deeply disturbing antisemitic hate...

We were dismayed today, when given an opportunity in a media session, tha Kyrie refused to unequivocally say he has no antisemitic beliefs, nor acknowledge specific hateful material in the film...

Such failure to disavow antisemitism when given a clear opportunity to do so is deeply disturbing, is against the values of our organization, and constitutes conduct detrimental to the team.

Below is Kyrie Irving's apology tweet for his antisemitic tweet and media interview. Also below are the consequences for his actions, in addition to losing his shoe deal with Nike (Nike statement to right).

kyrieirving While doing research on YHWH, I posted a Documentary that contained some false anti-Semitic statements, narratives, and language that were untrue and offensive to the Jewish Race/Religion, and I take full accountability and responsibly for my actions. I am grateful to have a big platform to share knowledge and want to move forward by having an open dialogue to learn more and grow from this.

To All Jewish families and Communities that are hurt and affected from my post, I am deeply sorry to have caused you pain, and apologize. I initially reacted out of emotion to being unjustly labeled Anti-Semitic, instead of focusing on the healing process of my Jewish Brothers and Sisters that were hurt from the hateful remarks made in the Documentary. I want to clarify any confusion on where I stand fighting against Anti- semticism by pologizing for posting the

documentary without context and a factual explanation outlining the specific beliefs in the Documentary agreed with and disagreed with. I had no intentions to disrespect any Jewish cultural history regarding the Holocaust or perpetuate any hate. am learning from this unfortunate event and hope we can find understanding between us all. I am no different than any other human being. I am a seeker of truth and knowledge, and I know who I Am.

Comedian Dave Chappelle went on Saturday Night Live (SNL) on November 12, 2022 and delivered a monologue that some have deemed antisemitic at worst, wildly inappropriate at best. A link to the video and full monologue transcript can be found below.

The monologue begins with:

Thank you, thank you very much for being here. Before I start tonight, I just wanted to read a brief statement that I prepared.

I denounce antisemitism in all its forms and I stand with my friends in the Jewish community. And that, Kanye, is how you buy yourself some time.

I gotta tell you guys, I've probably been doing this for 35 years now, and early in my career, I learned that there are two words in the English language that you should never say in sequence, and those words are 'the' and 'Jews.' Never heard someone do good after they said that.
