

HEBREW LANGUAGE COMPREHENSIVE EXAM (HLCE)

Educational Testing

In June 2011, the [NY State Education Department \(NYSED\)](#) stopped providing Regents Examinations in most world languages, including Hebrew. To fill the gap, The Jewish Education Project offers the Hebrew Language Comprehensive Exam (HLCE).

There are 4 parts to this **Checkpoint B** Exam:

1. Speaking – administered between April 1st and five days prior to the written test date
2. Listening
3. Reading
4. Writing

Scoring Point Distribution:

- Speaking = 24 credits (12 credits per task)
- Listening = 26 credits (2 credits per question)
- Reading = 30 credits (2 credits per question)
- Writing = 20 credits (10 credits per essay)
