## HEBREW LANGUAGE COMPREHENSIVE EXAM (HLCE)

In June 2011, the <u>NY State Education Department (NYSED)</u> stopped providing Regents Examinations in most world languages, including Hebrew. To fill the gap, The Jewish Education Project offers the Hebrew Language Comprehensive Exam (HLCE).

There are 4 parts to this **Checkpoint B** Exam:

- 1. Speaking administered between April 1<sup>st</sup> and five days prior to the written test date
- 2. Listening
- 3. Reading
- 4. Writing

## Scoring Point Distribution:

- Speaking = 24 credits (12 credits per task)
- Listening = 26 credits (2 credits per question)
- Reading = 30 credits (2 credits per question)
- Writing = 20 credits (10 credits per essay)
