The water covered the earth for 300 days, at the end of which the Teivah rested upon Har Ararat. After spending a full year in the Teivah, Noach and his family leave the Teivah and Hashem promises that the world will never experience such destruction again, and uses a rainbow as the symbol of that promise. Then we are told about Migdal Bavel and how Hashem intervened, causing all the people to speak different languages. The parsha ends with the introduction of Avram and Sarai.
