



Can you figure out which *menorah* below is extra? Look for clues to help you match each person with their *menorah*, and then see which one is left for you to use.







Step by Step







1. Start with the eyes, nose, and mouth. For the dizzy effect, make the pupils facing different directions and let its tongue hang out.




2. Make a square around the face and add eyebrows.




3. It's time to make your dreidel 3D. Add the side of the dreidel and two arms and hands, which should come from the middle.



4. Now draw the handle, the rest of the top, and the rounded bottom.




5. Finally, make some spin marks and a dizzy track on the floor.




Find the Differences

Celebrating Miracles


On Chanukah, we celebrate the miracles in life: both big and small. What are some miracles in your life? Write or draw them in the flames below.


Hidden Candles

My new virtual Chanukah game, The Chanu-Candle Hunt, is all about finding a *menorah*'s 8 missing candles by solving fun and challenging puzzles with the help of some wacky characters. Here's your chance to test your finding skills! Look carefully: all of the candles are camouflaged with their surroundings...



These 4 siblings are playing Dreidel together. Based on what they each spun during one round, imagine and draw what their facial expressions may be.

In case you need to review, here are the the basic rules of Dreidel: Everyone starts with an equal number of coins and takes turns spinning the dreidel. Each player puts a coin in the center of the play area (the "pot") at the beginning of each round. On your turn: If your dreidel lands on a *nun*, you get nothing. If you spin a *gimmel*, you get everything in the pot. Get a *hey*, and you get half of the pot. When you get a *shin*, you give a coin to the pot.



Bring this drawing to life and color by following this guide:




Share the Light
