

An original, silly, and Zoom-friendly Purim game of acting and confusion

Introduction:

Purim is known for being filled with laughter and fun as we celerate the miracle of the day. It's a day known for being upside down, but it feels like our world has already been turned on its head--for almost a full year! I wanted to put together a game that can lead to some laughter and silliness. Because even though Purim won't be the same this year, it still can be a lot of fun.

Game Premise:

Broken telephone meets charades... and Purim. Here's the basic gist: One person ("Player A") is given a card with something from the Purim story to act out. Player A acts it out for Player B, who acts it out for Player C, who acts it out for Player D--who has to guess what's going on. Of course, the act gets warped each round. Everyone will be laughing and scratching their heads as they try to figure out what the original card said.

How to play:

Game host chooses 4 players each round. I'll call them Player A, Player B, Player C, and Player D. Everyone else gets to be the audience.

Players B, C, and D look away while the game host gives Player A a card to act out. Player B is invited back, and Player A acts out the card in front of Player B. Player B pays attention to the act and then recreates it for Player C, who then



acts it out for Player D. Finally, Player D has to guess what the original card said. The round ends when Player D guesses correctly or gives up. Then the game host chooses 4 new people to play.

On Zoom:

Each round, game host should private chat the card's content to Player A, or have everyone turn away from their screens, with their cameras on, except for Player A--and then hold up the card. Once Player A sees the card, everyone can face the screen except for Players C and D.

Variations:

Instead of having everyone else be the audience, give the role of Player D to the rest of the game participants. See who can guess the correct answer first, each round.
